

Pre-Surgical Instructions

We recommend **prior** to your surgery:

- Continue all routine medications as prescribed.
- If you are on **blood thinners** such as Coumadin (Warfarin), Plavix, Eliquis, Xarelto, or Pradaxa, please be sure to notify our office and **DO NOT discontinue** these medications.
- If you take Aspirin or Aggrenox because of a history of disease (for example, heart attack
 or stroke), please continue this medication. If you take Aspirin in combination with another
 blood thinner, please do not discontinue Aspirin without first consulting with our surgical
 team. **In most situations, you will continue your blood thinner medications without interruption during your treatment with us.
- Please discontinue non-essential blood thinners (fish oil, vitamin E, flaxseed oil, and non-steroidal anti-inflammatories- such as Naproxen and Ibuprofen) 10 days before surgery. For patients with a history of severe arthritis, please notify your surgical team.
- For patients with a history of artificial heart valve or joints, please notify us if you routinely take antibiotics before dental or other surgical procedures.
- Do not consume alcohol for 48 hours prior to your procedure.
- Please minimize tobacco smoking as much as possible, as this has implications for healing.
- If you are unable to identify the treatment area/biopsied site, please call the office.

We recommend the following the day of your surgery:

- Please bring an updated medication list to your appointment.
- No fasting is required. Please eat breakfast or lunch before your appointment.
 Caffeine is fine.
- Please wear loose-fitting clothing (old button-up shirts are ideal). Avoid pullover shirts.
- Please bring any reading material or laptop/ipads (patient internet is available), as well as snacks.
- Having a driver is ideal in most situations, especially when we are working on the face due to the potential for swelling/bruising that may temporarily obscure your vision.
- Please do not wear make-up if the lesion is located on the face. For lesions on the beard area, please do not shave for 48 hours prior to surgery.

Surgical procedures may last for 3-5 hours or longer so please come prepared. Call our office at (401) 415-8586, option 3, to discuss any clinical questions with our surgical team prior to your appointment.
